## Dietrich Bonhoeffer

(1906 - 1945)

A man for whom Easter was a living reality

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a German pastor, theologian, ecumenist and Nazi resister. During his life he taught and wrote with great insight about Christian faith, the Church, discipleship, community, grace and ethics. With a deep personal faith, he regularly spoke of Jesus as 'the man for others' and was continually exploring the question "Who is Christ for us today?", usually providing rigorous responses to that question in the light of the circumstances and challenges of the day.

Born in 1906 into a large, tight knit, highly educated Prussian family, at the age of 14, and to his family's surprise, Dietrich decided he was going to be a theologian and ultimately, if largely posthumously, he became recognized as one of the great theologians of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Whilst he had a brilliant mind, becoming a Doctor of Theology at age 21, Bonhoeffer did not live solely in the academy but was engaged, both pastorally and as a prophetic voice, within the church congregations and wider communities he served in Germany and beyond, including times spent in New York and London.

In the early 1930s, as Hitler was rising to power, Bonhoeffer began to speak out publicly against the Nazis, particularly against Hitler's propaganda and persecution of the Jews and other minorities. He became a key founder member of the Confessing Church, opposing the support German churches gave to Hitler. Whilst subject to increasing hostility through the 1930s, it was when Bonhoeffer learnt of the atrocities the Nazi regime was inflicting during the war that he felt compelled to participate in a conspiracy that unsuccessfully attempted to take down Hitler. Imprisoned during the last two years of his life, he continued to write and provided pastoral support to both his guards and his fellow prisoners. Bonhoeffer was hanged at Flossenburg concentration camp on April 9, 1945. On being led to his execution, one of his prison guards reported Bonhoeffer to have said, "This is the end – but for me it is the beginning of Life!"

### **Bonhoeffer & Bramwell Booth**

In his biography of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Eric Metaxas writes of a foundational event in the development of Bonhoeffer's faith:

'In November 1921, at the age of fifteen, Bonhoeffer went to the first evangelistic meeting of his life. General Bramwell Booth of the Salvation Army had conducted ministry in Germany before the war, and in 1919, greatly moved by reports of suffering there, especially the hunger among children, he found a way around the official channels and was able to have milk distributed. He also gave five thousand pounds to relief efforts.

Two years later Booth came to Berlin to lead a series of evangelistic meetings. Thousands showed up, including many soldiers broken by the war. Sabine (his twin sister) recalled "Dietrich was eager to take part in it ...he was very interested (and) was impressed by the joy he had seen on Booth's face, and he told us of the people carried away by Booth, and of the conversions." A part of him was powerfully attracted to this sort of thing, but he wouldn't see anything like it again for 10 years, when he attended the Abyssinian Baptist Church in New York,'
