

On the weekend of June 8th/9th Bedlington Salvation Army will be celebrating our 146th Anniversary. We began life as a Christian Mission Station, one of 51 new Stations opened in 1878, but quickly became a Salvation. Army Corps when William Booth ordered the name of our movement to be changed from the Christian Mission to the 'Salvation Army' to better reflect a focussed evangelical perspective. ## GARDEN PROJECT PROGRESS

On Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> May, a group of around 20 people gathered to make a start on bringing the grounds of our building back into a better, useable space for everyone who uses the building. We want to say a huge thank you to everyone who came along. Lots of laughter and a very welcome supply of hot and cold drinks throughout to keep us all going...

On this first occasion we made a start at putting together raised beds, building a new bench and picnic table, painting fences, weeding pathways, cutting back the overgrown bushes that run down the side of the garden, as well as planting some new honeysuckle and other similar plants that will go on to provide both beautiful colour and aromas next spring, we also cleaned the climbing frame which is once again ready for the patter of tiny feet.

We have much still to do but are already seeing an increased ownership and use of the space as a result of everyone pulling together. Still to come are Wes' lessons on how to grow your own veg, and many more opportunities to help in various ways as the seasons allow. Our toddler and messy church groups are going to be putting their own skills to good use in planting bulbs and seeds and creating bug hotels and other little things to encourage wildlife.

Our back garden is a very serene space and, if you haven't already, try to spend time there as it develops and allow yourself to connect with the God of nature. We hear a lot about poor mental health in the news these days, and how the connection with the outdoors can help people to overcome battles with this, and hope that by taking some time in this space, it may help us all mentally and spiritually.
