STREET FOODBANK NEWS

The foodbank continues to be busy, and we are always thankful for donations of non perishable food that come through our door.

Whilst some of our shelves are full, we're still low on the following items:

 \Rightarrow Tinned Meat \Rightarrow Fruit Squash

 \Rightarrow UHT Milk \Rightarrow Crisps & Snacks

 \Rightarrow Tea Bags (packs of 80) \Rightarrow Tinned Custard

⇒ Instant Coffee
⇒ Strong shopping bags

We work with agencies to identify those in need of help, but we do sometimes take self referrals if necessary.

Food parcels that we provide contain non perishable food, fresh or frozen food from FareShare where possible, and Aldi vouchers. All of which provides a good offering of food to those who need it. We take food parcel requests up to 1.00pm each day and then aim to deliver out to clients that afternoon.



parents and carers to experience a warm welcome, play, learn and develop a supportive community. They come in all shapes and sizes and are a place where the love of God can be experienced in so

many ways but especially through the warm welcome that is offered to all who attend.

Here in Street, we are really blessed with a very busy Parent and Toddler group on a Tuesday and Wednesday morning each week.

Some weeks we can see up to 60 children and just as many parents/carers!

We always have plenty of toys out for play and some craft activities for them to do, which are often faith-based. Check out the toddler board by the kitchen to see their latest creations pinned up there! At the moment we're doing a 'Sky's the limit' board, and there are



kites and hot air balloons on there from recent sessions.

There are plenty of snacks for the children (and parents!) while the sessions are on and they all enjoy a sing-along at the end. It's part of our mission to our community; an opportunity for parents to come and have a chat and a tea or coffee with others while their little ones get to play. We offer a safe, welcoming and friendly space and a listening ear, and offer prayer where its needed.

Refugee Week - 17 to 23 June



Even in the midst of a housing crisis, most people in the UK and Europe are fortunate enough to have a safe, secure, physical home. The UN reports that 1.6 billion people live in inadequate housing conditions.

For many people seeking sanctuary, there are significant barriers to accessing housing, even in the UK. The British Red Cross's commissioned research shows that Ukrainians are 4x more likely to be homeless, or be at risk of homelessness than the general population. The Refugee Council's 2024 'Keys to the City Report' reports that 2 in 5 refugees granted asylum in London



were reported as homeless/living on the streets. We may have a safe, secure, physical home but we cannot forget our responsibility to those who don't. Hebrews 13:2 says, 'Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it'; and Matthew 25:34-40 speaks of this responsibility strongly. The Founder of The Salvation Army William Booth's reported words echo in our ears: 'Go and do something!'



Prayer Matters is a resource that seeks to inform, encourage, disciple and ensure that the UK and Ireland Territory is immersed in prayer.

We want to pray for renewal in our worship and mission, and we want to pray for the people God is sending us to.

Each day of the week has a theme, and the themes are based on the five following 'Mission Priorities':
