I may be showing my age here, but I'm a little sceptical of a rebrand - whether it's Jif to Cif, Marathon to Snickers or Opal Fruits to Starburst. I don't always get the point. But the renaming of our annual fundraising event from the 'Big Collection' to 'The Big Connection' is one with which even I can genuinely get on board!



Moving away from framing the appeal as simply collecting funds and into a deeper, more profound reminder of how it can be used to deepen relationships and build bridges within our communities resonates not only with our DNA as a movement but is rooted within Scripture. Much of Paul's writings to the Church were focused on improving relationships, creating connections and building community. I love his first letter to the Corinthians and chapter 12 when he uses the image of a body: 'For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ' (verse 12).

As we move forward, my prayer would be that this renaming is more than a simple rebrand but a reminder that we were raised up to be connected - to God, to each other and to our communities.
