

An elderly Chinese man had 2 large pots, each hung on the ends of a pole which he carried across his neck. One of the pots had a crack in it while the other pot was perfect and always delivered a full portion of water. At the end of the long walk from the stream to the house, the cracked pot arrived only half full. This went on daily for a full 2 years—the man bringing home only one and a half pots of water. Of course the perfect pot was proud of its

accomplishments. But the poor cracked pot was ashamed of its own imperfection and miserable that it could only do half of what it had been made to do. After 2 years of what it perceived to be bitter failure, it spoke to the man one day by the stream. 'I'm ashamed of

myself because this crack in my side causes water to leak out all the way back to your house.' The old man smiled. 'Did you notice that there are flowers on your side of the path, but not on the other pot's side? That's because I have always known about your flaw, so I planted flower seeds on your side of the path and everyday while we walk back, you water them.

For 2 years, I have been able to pick these beautiful flowers to decorate the table. Without you being just the way you are, there would not be this beauty to grace the house!'

This is a parable expressing the need to accept ourselves for who we are, how God made us. Each of us have our own unique flaw but it's the cracks and flaws we each have that make our lives together so very interesting and rewarding. We should always be accepting and enjoy our differences in ourselves and in others.



One thought I had when I read the parable was: shame the man never thought of alternating the cracked pot, shoulder to shoulder on his daily walks, then he would have had flowers on both sides of the path! I've been called a crack pot on occasion, but my hope is that I leak a little good along the path I walk every day—we never really know the actual benefits that are a result of our leaking a little goodness, kindness, love and understanding. Always pray to have eyes that see the best in people; a heart that forgives the worst; a mind that forgets the bad and a soul that never loses faith in God.

Psalm 25:4-5 says: "show me your ways Lord, teach me your paths. Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Saviour and my hope is in you all day long." Be blessed, Bev.
