In 1892, as part of William Booth's vision the Hadleigh Farm Colony was started. 8th January 1938 the original Hadleigh Temple Corps building was opened








By 2001 it was believed that the hall was too small. It was demolished and new new hall opened in 2003

#### **WORSHIP**

#### **YOUNG PEOPLE**

Working with children is a clear priority for us. Our toddler groups are attended to capacity. Our linked BP sections thrive and work alongside other activities aimed at children, including sleep-overs and film nights. In partnership with Hadleigh Farm Estate we offer a variety of activities for all ages indoors and outdoors





#### **SILVER SERVICE CLUB**

The Silver Service Club seeks to meet the needs of older residents and to combat loneliness and bring joy. Hundreds of members come every week for entertainment, friendship and to hear the good news of the gospel.



#### **OUR OPEN DOORS**

Our open doors mean people can drop in Monday to Friday when refreshment, both physical, emotional and spiritual, is offered in a non-judgemental welcoming way. The bereavement counselling service and advice centre are particularly popular along with debt and other counselling. We support refugees families in partnership with other agencies in the town.

We hold regular social events to develop and support good, strong relationships within the fellowship.

We spend a large proportion of our resources, time and money working outside our buildings, reaching out into areas such as local housing estates. We are working to plant new worshipping congregations in various parts of Castle Point.



#### **OUR TEAM**

We also have interns, trainees and Salvation Army Cadets working with us. We also have contract cleaners keeping the building spotless.



#### **OUR FINANCE**

Our members' giving is generous and, along with the profit of our shops, enables the corps to run without Mission Support from Divisional Headquarters. We do claim mission resources for new projects and initiatives and at least 10% of our income is spent on outreach activities.

We support other corps and local initiatives where we can. Our harvest and Self-Denial offerings increase year on year.





#### **OUR FACILITIES**

We maintain our property to the highest standard. The fixtures, furniture and fittings are all fit for purpose and up-to-date. We have solar panels, bike racks and electric car charging points and have a healthy and ethical green procurement policy and procedures. Having achieved Bronze Eco-church status, we are moving towards the silver award. Our building is used by many community groups who share our mission values. Our hall is a recognised destination and venue for concerts and events, attracting people locally and from further afield. The flexibility afforded by the movable walls enables us to seat up to 300 people in the main worship space.
