

PRAYER MATTERS

Hello, welcome to the second instalment of Proverbs. It really is a fascinating book with a wealth of information on how we should live our lives as God's people.

Bible verse for the week: 'Start with God- the first step in learning is bowing down to God, only fools thumb their noses at such wisdom and learning' (Proverbs 1 v 7 Message Translation)

Monday 9 September – 'The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom. And the knowledge of the Holy one is understanding' (Proverbs 9 v 10 NIV). The reverence for God that comes with acknowledging His sovereignty and holiness and recognising that He is the true source of wisdom and knowledge is the making of a wise person. True wisdom is both a gift of God as well as the result of seeking and searching. I have learnt that placing my dilemmas in life before God in prayer, not only brings me peace but also the assurance that God will give me the answer. Not always immediately, often I must wait until the time is right. Pray for the wisdom you may need today and then wait patiently.

Tuesday 10 September – In Proverbs chapter ten we read some wise sayings of Solomon. They are an either/or situation. I have used the Message translation, and many need no explanation, but I feel, as I was, that you will be stirred to think of how your actions impact, not only on your life, but also on the lives of others. I have selected a few in the coming days for you to ponder on. Pray that God will give insight as you study them more closely.

Wednesday 11 September -

Proverbs 10 v 7: 'A good and honest life is a blessed memorial; a wicked life leaves a horrible stench'.

Proverbs 10 v 9: 'Honesty lives confident and carefree, but Shifty is sure to be exposed'.

Thursday 12 September -

Proverbs 10 v 10: 'An evasive eye is a sign of trouble ahead, but an open, face to face meeting results in peace'.

Proverbs 10 v 11: 'The mouth of a good person is a deep life-giving well, but the mouth of the wicked is a dark cave of abuse'.

Friday 13 September -

Proverbs 10 v 12: 'Hatred starts fights, but love pulls a quilt over bickering'.

Proverbs 10 v 14: 'The wise accumulate knowledge – a true treasure, know-it-all's talk too much – a sheer waste of time'.

There's much to think about in those 8 verses, it's hard-hitting honesty about the way we should live as God's children. I was really challenged, and as I've said many times, I'm still a work in progress. May I suggest that maybe it's time to pray honestly, asking God to point us in the right direction to continue living a Godly life.

Saturday 14 September – Solomon now goes on to speak about the fact that a disciplined, righteous life is reflected in our day to day living.

Proverbs 10 v 17: 'The road to life is a disciplined life'.

Proverbs 10 v 22: 'God's blessings make you rich; nothing we do can improve on God'.

Proverbs 10 v 27: 'The fear of God expands your life'.

Proverbs 10 v 29: 'God is a solid backing to a well lived life'.

Proverbs 10 v 30: 'Good people last – they can't be moved'.

Pray for God's grace to help you live a holy life.

Sunday 15 September – There's been so much to think about this week. I pray you may have been prompted to pick up your Bible and read Proverbs in more detail. There are so many do's and don'ts, and pointers to living a good life. I leave you this week with words from **Psalm 1:1-3 from 'Psalms Now' by Leslie F Brandt.....**

'The persons who choose to live significant lives are not going to take their cues from the religiously indifferent.

Nor will they conform to the crowd, nor mouth their prejudices, nor dote on the failures of others.

Their ultimate concern is the will of God. They make their daily decisions in respect of such.

Compare them to a sturdy tree planted in rich, moist soil. As the tree yields fruit, so their lives manifest blessings for others.

And are purposeful and productive'.
