

PRAYER MATTERS

Hello, welcome to the third instalment of Proverbs. As we turn this week to Proverbs 15, we see several references to body parts. I hope you find it an interesting read.

Bible verse for the week: 'The eyes of the Lord are in every place. Keeping watch on the evil and good' (Proverbs 15:3 NKJ)

Monday 16 September – Creative illustrations are used in this chapter to help us clearly understand what it takes to live a Godly life. Today we consider the words that come out of our mouth. Again, this week we will use the message translation. Chapter 15 verse 1: 'A gentle response diffuses anger'. And chapter 15 verse 4: 'Kind word help and heal'. I guess, like me, you've said things hurriedly without thought and wish you could take the words back. Unfortunately, you can't, and as much as you apologise, they remain spoken. Pray for God's wisdom to think before you speak.

Tuesday 17 September – Read verse 13: 'A cheerful heart brings a smile to your face'. I once heard someone say, 'What's a matter with her, her face is set in cement!' although I understood what they meant, I thought it was an unkind remark to make but it made realise the importance of being cheerful and sharing a smile. In Thessalonians 15 verse 16 we read, 'Be joyful always'. Pray that God will grant you a cheerful heart.

Wednesday 18 September – Read verse 30: 'A twinkle in the eye means joy in the heart'. Have you ever looked at someone and seen hurt, despair or sadness in their eyes. Somehow, they've lost their sparkle. A sure signal that they may need help or a listening ear. Pray for God's guidance to be alert to someone's feelings.

Thursday 19 September – Read verse 23: 'The right word at the right time – beautiful'. This links in with my thought yesterday. Perceptiveness of another's persons need, not in a nosey way, but in love and kindness. Pray that God will give you the right words at the right time.

Friday 20 September – Read verse 31: 'Listen to good advice if you want to live well'. I wonder how many times you have been told to 'pay attention!' For me, lapses of concentration still happen, more often these days! But in a spiritual sense it is important that we listen, learn, and have an awareness of God speaking to us in many ways. For example, through people, things around us, in our prayer time and devotions. Pray that you will be 'tuned-in' to all God is saying to you today.

Saturday 21 September – And finally for this week ... read verse 14: 'An intelligent person is always eager to take in more truth'. We never stop learning there's always something new. The number of times I hear myself saying 'I never knew that!' we learn from each other all the time. More importantly we should learn in a spiritual way, through our devotions, the Bible, worship, talking to other Christian, and so the list continues. Pray that God will give you a thirst to learn more about Him and deepen your relationship with Him.

Sunday 22 September – Psalm 51:10-12 from 'Psalms Now' by Leslie F Brandt ... 'Revive my flagging spirit, O God. Restore to me the joy of assurance of a right relationship with You.

Reinstate me in Your purposes and help me avoid the snares and pitfalls along this earthly path.' Amen
