PRAYER MATTERS

Here is our last look at Proverbs, I hope you've found these thoughts useful and challenging as I have whilst preparing them. This week I have chosen a few random proverbs, some you may know well.

Bible verse for the week: 'He who walks with integrity, walks securely' (Proverbs 10:9 NKJ)

Monday 23 September – The Hebrew word 'Integrity' is used 16 times in the Bible. It means 'the condition of being without blemish, completeness, perfection, sincerity, soundness, uprightness, wholeness', Wow, now that's something for us to think about! Chapter 20 verse 7 reads: 'The righteous man walks in his integrity; his children are blessed after him'. Pray that the Holy Spirit will help you to live a spirit-filled life.

Tuesday 24 September – Chapter 20 verse 24: 'The very steps we take, come from God; otherwise, how would we know where we're going'. Another phrase comes to mind, 'In all your ways acknowledge Him and He will direct your path' (Chapter 3 verse 6). There's a definite theme here isn't there? Pray for God's guidance in all you do, every decision you make. even in the things that don't seem too important to you, they are to God.

Wednesday 25 September – Chapter 20 verse 29: 'Youth may be admired for vigour, but grey hair gives prestige to old age'. Love this one, I wonder why? Growing old may bring its difficulties but it also brings, experience of life. Don't write yourself off as useless, we oldies still have much to give, for example help and encouragement, prayer matters, a listening ear, a cheery smile, a welcoming cuppa, a card or letter ... Pray that God will give you opportunities.

Thursday 26 September – Chapter 22 verse 6: 'Train up a child in the way he/she should go, and when he/she is old he/she will not depart from it'. Now that's a responsibility for us all, parents, grandparents, teachers, church fellowship, friends, family ... we all have a part to play. Pray that God will grant us the wisdom and grace to fulfil this task.

Friday 27 September – Chapter 25 verse 15: 'Patient persistence pierces through indifference; gentle speech breaks down rigid differences'. I often remember my Mum saying 'Slowly and gently does it' when I was becoming exasperated about something. It's so true, after all Rome wasn't built in a day! Pray: *Lord, grant me the gentleness of a dove and the patience of a saint to conquer indifference. Amen.*

Saturday 28 September – Chapter 28 verse 14: 'A tender-hearted person lives a blessed life'. This infers that we should be gentle and kind, showing love, kindness, or pity, be compassionate, merciful, and sensitive to the needs of others. I wonder how you match up to this, I know that I fall far short of this ideal, another work in progress! Pray: Lord, grant me the gift of a tender-heart, then help me to use it with compassion. Amen.

Sunday 29 September – After a month of looking at Proverbs, just scratching the surface really, we have considered many facets of Godly living and maybe taken stock of our own lives. So, I now leave the closing verses of **Psalm 22 from 'Psalms Now' by Leslie F Brandt** … 'I dedicate myself anew to You, O Lord. I will serve You whatever the cost or consequence. You are my God. Regardless of my feelings of insignificance and inadequacy, I will praise Your name and proclaim Your love to people all around me'. Amen.
