For only the third time in the past 20 years, the UN has declared a full-blown famine.

The famine is consuming much of the country. It is almost certain to be as bad as, or worse than, the one that afflicted Ethiopia in the 1980s. If help does not arrive very soon, it may prove the worst anywhere in the world since millions starved to death during China's Great Leap Forward in the late 1950s and early 1960s.

In an "optimistic scenario", in which fighting stops and this year's harvest, expected in October, is slightly better than the last, prediction indicate around 6m "excess deaths" by 2027. In the (more likely) scenario in which fighting continues until early next year, more than 10m may perish..

The cause of the famine is Sudan's civil war, which began in April 2023, when the army and an auxiliary paramilitary, the Rapid Support Forces (RSF), fell out. The ensuing conflict has a strong claim to be the biggest and most destructive in the world today. Perhaps 150,000 people have been killed by the fighting itself. At least 245 towns or villages have been burnt. Much of Khartoum, the capital, has been flattened. More than 20% of the country's pre-war population of roughly 50m have been forced to flee their homes. involved. (The Economist 31/8/24)
