Care for Creation Goals

After the recent focus on the Mission Priority 'Care for Creation', the following goals have been agreed by the Mission Council. If you can help in any way or want to know more - please see Joe Saint.

- Electronic Christmas card available, encourage people to reduce actual cards (in place)
- Messy Church, etc. to be more mindful about using sustainable materials (by November 2025)
- Provide containers for coffee grounds in kitchen and at coffee machine and organise how/where to dispose (by December 2025)
- Improve recycling: (by 10th January 2025)
 - o Increase number of recycling bins in rooms
 - o Reduce the number of 'normal' bins in rooms
 - o People tasked with emptying and sorting recycling bins
 - Try to obtain green wheelie bins for bin cupboard
- Bring a small group of people together to complete Eco Church Questionnaire https://ecochurch.arocha.org.uk/ (by February 2025)
- Investigate possibilities of food waste collection from council or elsewhere (by February 2025)
- Identify someone to liaise with local councillors so we can join with local litter picking sessions (by February 2025)
- Plan a 'Meat free week' during 2025 (by February 2025)
- Work with THQ re installation of solar panels (ongoing)
- Occasional articles in weekly bulletin regarding 'Care for Creation' initiatives/ ideas/ advice (ongoing)
- Investigate the possibility of installing Swift boxes on roof and offering 'sponsor a box' to congregation (by April 2025)
- 'Care for Creation' Newsletter to be produced twice a year to communicate news and share easy ideas for individuals to implement in church and at home (By June 2025)
