
Love Others A warm welcome as we gather as the family of God today, especially if you are not normally with us on a Sunday.



Prayers for Maxine, friend of Tara Lipinski, receiving treatment for cancer. And prayers for Tara as well as she is affected by her friends condition.


Uphold a friend of Jack Freeston who recently had a massive heart attack.
